CompuLynx Transforms Aid Delivery for Hunger Safety Net Programme Beneficiaries

About Hunger Safety Net Programme

The Hunger Safety Net Programme 2 (HSNP) is one of the four government Cash Transfer programmes under the National Safety Nets Programme (NSNP). The programme has been implemented in two Phases. Phase 1, starting with a pilot from 2008-2012, funded by DFID & Australian Department for Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). Phase two (HSNP2) of the programme started in 2013 - 2018, funded by the Governments of Kenya and United Kingdom.

HSNP is a government led programme, under the Ministry of Devolution and Planning, managed by the National Drought Management Authority (NDMA). The overall objective of HSNP is to reduce extreme hunger and vulnerability by delivering regular and unconditional cash transfers of Kshs. 5,400 every two months (starting from July 2016) to targeted households.

The Challenge

DFID with OXFAM and Government of Kenya wanted to disburse fixed amount to people affected by post-election violence through a Bank. The project scope was to support poorest and vulnerable groups in four Arid Counties of Turkana, Mandera, Wajir and Marsabit.

The Solution

Equity Bank partnered with CompuLynx to provide a disbursement solution using e-Voucher software to beneficiaries of Hunger Safety Net Programme. The solution enables Equity Bank to disburse cash using Smart card and Biometric validation to over 100,000+ households in the field through its 200+ agents.
